Damani White-Lewis is an Assistant Professor in the Graduate School of Education at the University of Pennsylvania. He studies racial inequality in academic careers and contexts using theories and methods from organizational behavior and social psychology. His work has been funded by the National Institutes of Health, National Science Foundation, and has appeared in The Journal of Higher Education, Review of Higher Education, Research in Higher Education, and Teachers College Record. He received his Ph.D. in Higher Education & Organizational Change from the University of California, Los Angeles.
